Participants will leave this training with a multitude of online resources that will provide them with free materials, tasks & ideas so that they can continue creating well-designed activities for their students.

- Learn how to reduce students’ anxiety and resulting behavior challenges by creating predictability and structure within environments and activities

- Identify the four questions that are visually answered through a well-designed and individualized work system
- Learn how to create and differentiate work activities to facilitate independence and generalize previously taught skills
